Public Participation

Ms. Steigerwald wanted to make sure that Council was aware there will not be anything inappropriate going on with the Pride event to be held at the Century Village this weekend. She stated everyone will be respectful.

Mr. Manard wanted to speak with a biblical perspective for the community and said he is a caring individual but did not agree with the event to be held.

Ms. Zelch stated she is one of the organizers of the event and is trying to lower suicide rates in the LGBTQ community.

Ms. Domanski stated this will be a family event where people can come and feel comfortable and accepted.

Several members of churches spoke, one that wanted to end bullying of children in general since he felt it is unfair his son cannot wear a shirt with political opinions on it

but children within the LGBTQ community have to be accepted in schools. Another church member spoke on behalf of the Pride event and said they are looking forward to having a table with literature available to anyone that needs assistance with felling loved and accepted.

Ms. Hare said her son was bullied in school for being gay and he could not wait to get out of Geauga County after school.

Mr. Fabian read a letter his wife wrote in support of the event.

Mr. Litter said he does not agree with the Pride event or the lifestyle due to his religious beliefs.
